

The Laramie County Clerk, in conjunction with the Cheyenne League of Women Voters, is hosting a series of Saturday voter 'drop in' events at the Laramie County Library.

The events offer residents the opportunity to get information on voter registration and voting, and to learn more about participating in elections in Laramie County. Voter registration information and opportunities will be available to new or previously unregistered residents, including young people who will turn 18 years of age by election day. Persons currently registered may update their information at the event (name change, address).

In order to register to vote, a person must be a U.S. citizen, resident of Laramie County, age 18 or over by election day, not declared mentally incompetent by a court of law, and not convicted of a felony (unless voting rights were restored.) Persons wanting to register will be asked to present their Wyoming driving license or ID card, if they have one. Examples of other acceptable document are military ID, U.S. passport, driving license issued by another state, or student ID.

The first event takes place this Saturday, June 16, 10:00 am. to noon, in the Cottonwood Room, first floor, of the Laramie County Library. Other events are scheduled for July 14, 3:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m., and Sept. 22, 10:00 a.m. to noon.
