Tuesday, November 5

Absentee/Early Voting: October 7 – November 4

Deadline to Change Political Affiliation: October 21, During Early Voting or on General Election Day

## FAQs

**Q:** What do I need to bring with me when I go to vote?

**A:** You must present an acceptable form of ID when voting early or at the polls.

**Q:** Where do I go to vote on Election Day? **A:** Visit our website for a complete list of vote centers. You may vote at any location, 7 am to 7 pm.

**Q:** How do I know what district I'm in? **A:** Enter your address on our Precinct and Voter Info Interactive Map on our website. During an election, your sample ballot will be available to view or print.

# Acceptable Identification for Registering to Vote

Acceptable identification may be any one or more of the following:

- Wyoming Driver's License;
- United States Passport;
- Driver's License or Identification Card issued by any State or Outlying Possession of the United States;
- Identification Card issued by the Federal Government, any State or Local Government, or an Agency thereof;
- A tribal ID of any Federally Recognized Tribe;
- Photo Identification Card issued by the University of Wyoming, a Wyoming Community College, or a Wyoming Public School;
- United States Military Card; or
- Identification Card issued to a Dependent of a member of the United States Armed Forces.

### Voter ID

Effective July 1, 2021, Wyoming voters are required to show an acceptable form of identification when voting in person. Any of the following is accepted:

- WY Driver's License or ID Card
- Tribal ID Card
- Valid US Passport
- US Military Card
- DL or ID Card from Another State
- University of Wyoming Student ID
- Wyoming Community College Student ID
- Wyoming Public School Student ID
- Wyoming Concealed Firearm Permit
- Valid Medicare Insurance Card
- Valid Medicaid Insurance Card

## Registering to Vote

#### **QUALIFICATIONS:**

- Be 18 years of age on Election Day;
- Be a U.S. citizen;
- Be a resident of Wyoming and the precinct in which you register;
- Provide your valid Wyoming driver's license;
  - If you do not have your current valid driver's license with you, you must provide the number and additional acceptable identification as noted below;
  - If you have not been issued a Wyoming driver's license or yours is expired, you must provide:
    - A statement to that effect (on the Wyoming registration application);
    - The last four digits of your social security number; and
    - Additional acceptable identification.
- Not convicted of a felony, or if convicted, has had civil or voting rights restored;
- Not be adjudicated mentally incompetent; and
- Withdraw your voter registration from any other jurisdiction, if applicable (on the Wyoming registration application).

# How To Get an Absentee Ballot

Registered voters can request an absentee at any time during an election year except on the day of the election. There are three ways to submit your request:

- 2. **Call** us at (307) 633-4242
- 3. **Email** <u>election@laramiecountywy.gov</u> (Subject: Absentee *your name*)

With your request, you must also provide your full name, date of birth, your residential and mailing addresses, contact number, and for the Primary election, your political party affiliation.

Return your voted ballot by mail, deliver it to our office, or use the secured ballot drop box located outside our office building.

# Making Changes to Your Voter Registration

To update your name or address on your voter registration, bring an acceptable form of identification to our office at any time, except during early voting or on Election Day when you will make those changes at the polls.

For a Primary election, voters can change their party affiliation any time before the first day of candidate filing. For a General election, a voter may change party affiliation at our office not less than 14 days before Election Day or at the polls during early voting or on Election Day. An ID and signature is required to make this change.
